WHAT SHOULD YOU MENTION TO YOUR VACCINATION PROVIDER BEFORE YOU GET THE NOVAVAX COVID-19 VACCINE?

Tell your vaccination provider about all of your medical conditions, including if you:

- have any allergies
- have had myocarditis (inflammation of the heart muscle) or pericarditis (inflammation of the lining outside the heart)
- have a fever
- have a bleeding disorder or are on a blood thinner
- are immunocompromised or are on a medicine that affects your immune system
- are pregnant or plan to become pregnant
- are breastfeeding
- have received another COVID-19 vaccine
- have ever fainted in association with an injection

WHO SHOULD NOT GET THE NOVAVAX COVID-19 VACCINE?

You should not get the Novavax COVID-19 Vaccine, Adjuvanted if you:

- had a severe allergic reaction after a previous dose of this vaccine
- had a severe allergic reaction to any ingredient of this vaccine

WHAT ARE THE INGREDIENTS IN THE NOVAVAX COVID-19 VACCINE?

The Novavax COVID-19 Vaccine, Adjuvanted contains a recombinant form of the SARS-CoV-2 spike protein produced from baculovirus infected Sf9 (fall armyworm) insect cells and MatrixMTM adjuvant containing saponins derived from the soapbark tree (*Quillaja saponaria* Molina). Other ingredients include cholesterol, phosphatidylcholine, potassium dihydrogen phosphate, potassium chloride, disodium hydrogen phosphate dihydrate, sodium chloride, disodium hydrogen phosphate heptahydrate, sodium dihydrogen phosphate monohydrate, polysorbate 80, and water for injection. The vaccine may also contain small amounts of baculovirus and insect cell proteins and DNA.

HOW IS THE NOVAVAX COVID-19 VACCINE, ADJUVANTED GIVEN?

The Novavax COVID-19 Vaccine, Adjuvanted will be given to you as an injection in the muscle. The Novavax COVID-19 Vaccine, Adjuvanted is administered as a two-dose series, 3 weeks apart.

CAN PREGNANT AND BREASTFEEDING WOMEN GET THE NOVAVAX COVID-19 VACCINE?

While pregnant and breastfeeding women can have the Novavax vaccine, there is more safety data on the Pfizer and Moderna vaccines than with the Novavax vaccine. However, there are no theoretical safety concerns relating to use in pregnancy, since the Novavax vaccine, similarly to other COVID-19 vaccines, is not a live vaccine.

CAN I GET NOVAVAX COVID-19 VACCINE WITH OTHER VACCINES?

Yes, except for the vaccines available for orthopoxviruses, ACAM2000 and JYNNEOS. ACAM2000 has been linked to myocarditis. We don't know if there's an increased risk of myocarditis with JYNNEOS yet, but if you've received a dose of one of these orthopox vaccines, CDC suggests waiting four weeks to get a COVID vaccine dose.
