

EUI (Emergency Use Instructions)-

Uses of the COVID-19 Vaccine permitted under EUI

What are ‘Emergency Use Instructions (EUI)?’

- Persons 12 years and older as a second primary dose 3–8 weeks after the first primary dose, especially those at higher risk of myocarditis associated with mRNA COVID-19 vaccines.
- Persons 12 years and older as an additional (third) primary dose in those with certain immunocompromising conditions, a primary dose in those with incomplete primary dose series, and/or a booster dose after receiving certain non-FDA authorized or approved COVID-19 vaccines (for example, certain vaccines available outside of the United States or vaccines used in clinical trials).
- Persons 18 years and older with certain immunocompromising conditions as an additional dose after receiving primary vaccination with the Janssen COVID-19 Vaccine.
- Persons 12 years and older with a moderately or severely immunocompromising condition who received dose(s) of COVID-19 vaccine prior to or during treatment with certain therapies (HCT or CAR-T-cell therapy) should be revaccinated with the COVID-19 vaccine by Pfizer-BioNTech, regardless of which vaccine was received initially.
